Richard Grosvenor's Spring Bull Gallery on Bellevue Avenue in Newport sits across from the Newport Art Museum with which he's intimately involved; in the middle of a city to which he continues to bring life through his landscapes and architectural sketches; and a short distance from the sea, the inspiration for many of his works.

Ask Richard his philosophy about painting, and he'll at first tell you that he really doesn't have one. But when prodded, he says, that in teaching painting and architecture he suggests that "you don't have to follow all the rules." Perhaps, it is as much a reflection of his lifestyle as it is his philosophy of painting.

Richard Grosvenor is among Rhode Island's most prominent artists. He was selected by the White House Historical Society to paint a scene of the White House for their 2000 Bi-Centennial Calendar, commissioned by President and Mrs. Clinton. His Tall Ship watercolor, painted in June 2000, appeared on a commemorative envelope issued by the United State Post Office. He has won numerous awards, and his watercolors and oils have been purchased by institutions throughout the United States and are in numerous private collections.
